## The gift of life stories – 10 years on

This year is a milestone for the Calvary Biography Service – 10 years of giving palliative patients the beautiful gift of sharing their life stories.

Ten years on and the service is still coordinated by volunteers. It has been wonderful to see the service extended to people in the community along with

the Mary Potter Hospice and St Helen's ward at Calvary North Adelaide Hospital.

There has also been a very special partner sharing this 10 year journey – HPS came on board as the sole sponsor in 2008 and continues in that important role today.

This means vital funds to help with the purchase of equipment and office supplies, to running the eight week training course for new volunteer Biographers, to giving everyone involved in the program the opportunity to attend seminars and conferences to help them in their roles.

Over the 10 years, over 300 people have had the chance to share their story. One patient

who recently completed her biography sent the following note to the team:

"I am so grateful for the provision of this service, not

forgetting the wonderful volunteers who give their time and talents for this purpose. There is no doubt my family will enjoy reading about my experiences, which have been many and varied. There is also no doubt I would not have been able to produce this biography on my own."

### ALWAYS LEARNING AND GROWING

One of our values is 'Learn and Grow' which is our commitment to embrace learning and personal growth as a life long journey. That is why it means so much to us that staff in the Hospice are also on a continual learning journey.

We are so grateful that since 2008, the Crotti family and San Remo through the Aldo Crotti Scholarships program has supported a number of fantastic learning and development opportunities for the staff who provide palliative care.



In the 10th year of this amazing program we can reflect on just what this support has made possible. From tertiary post graduate studies, to attending international, national and state conferences and seminars to weekly education at the bedside – there have been so many opportunities that ultimately drive the best possible care for patients and their families.

Enrolled nurse, Yukari is just one of the nurses to benefit. She completed the Distance Education Course in Palliative Care Nursing at Flinders University.

## Nursing care at the heart of the Hospice

We often hear beautiful comments from grateful family members who want to give thanks for the care of their loved one.

To take the time to say thank you, soon after

their loss is testament to how much the nursing care means to everyone touched by it.

Recently we received a note which included the words 'the Hospice nursing care should be the benchmark of care for everyone when you come to the end of your life'. What a compliment!

No-one could deny that the nurses have a very difficult job. But when you speak to them or see them at work, it becomes clear that they have purpose and a passion for what they do. This reflects in the way they look after not only their patients, but family members, visitors and each other.

We know that the nurses are at the heart of the Hospice, but behind every nurse is an extra-special person. **This person is you.** 

It is your support that gives the nurses the time,

the resources and the equipment they need to deliver the care. Every week the Foundation commits \$13,440.00 towards nursing care. When we break it down, this equates to \$120.00 per patient per day.

To help meet this cost and to generate a steady and reliable source of funding we have created a monthly giving program called

'Heart for Hospice'. For only \$10.00 each month you can become the special person behind a patient's care, for one day each year.
