# Thank you for the gift of care when it was needed most

   The staff are now able to create special moments for patients and their families.


- You enabled us to expand our support of the Palliative Home Care Service by providing practical assistance such as gardening and house cleaning to families caring for a loved one at home.

#### Silver linings during COVID-19

When we were faced with social distancing and COVID-19 restrictions in South Australian health facilities, much of the extra care, comfort and joy you help bring to patients and families had to be put on hold. These were challenging times for everyone. When restrictions eased, we felt blessed that you were there to make each day more memorable for patients and their families.

Your gifts made so much possible during the 2020/2021 financial year including:

#### A toast to farewell mum

In June we launched Russell's Drinks Trolley, named after our volunteer Russell, who built and brought the trolley that we have longed dreamed of, to life!

You help us offer a variety of drinks for patients and families to choose from. The first family to get a taste of the trolley, was a family who only an hour beforehand had to say their final goodbyes to their mum. Her favourite drink – a sparkling wine – was popped and poured to celebrate her life and say farewell to their mum.





#### The comeback of a sweet old tradition

For anyone who visited the Hospice many years ago, you might remember the *Sweets Trolley*. Thanks to you it has made its way back this year. Volunteers love taking it around in the afternoon, tempting everyone with a variety of cakes and slices. We love nothing more than seeing a patient who has started to lose their appetite – eat something they enjoy. This always brings a smile to the faces of their loved ones.



#### Individual and Meaningful Care

We responded to 172 individual support requests such as celebrations, special meals, family gatherings and equipment hire. We also held 22 group activities on special occasions such as St Patrick's Day, Mother's Day and Grand Final Day. On Melbourne Cup Day in the Hospice, we had a lot going on! With the Hospice team decked out in bright colours and rocking their fascinators, the Foundation arranged a special guest to do the rounds.

Scarlett a gorgeous little pony made her way around the Hospice, giving love, cuddles and joy to patients, families (and quite a few nurses!). Scarlett brought so many smiles to everyone, and even a few tears.

#### Keeping the kitchen shelves stocked

The family kitchen continues to be the heart of the Hospice thanks to you. You help us stock the kitchen every week with cereal, coffee, soup, chocolate, cakes and lots of sandwiches in the fridge for patients and their families to enjoy. Family members living in with their loved one are so grateful to have access to the kitchen 24/7.





### Creating treasured memories and mementoes to families

The Fra Angelico program was the only program not affected by COVID-19. This program continued right through lockdown, giving patients the opportunity to create mementoes for loved ones – especially those unable to visit due to the restrictions.



Thanks to you, we were able to extend our support during 2020/21.

New initiatives in the Mary Potter Units in 2020/21 included:

- a welcome pack for new patients
- funding for patient support activities
- Fra Angelico Creative Arts
- Children's Activity packs
- and in the Cancer Centre reflexology is now offered during chemotherapy treatments.

At the request of staff, we organised their first Walk for Love. One week before our North Adelaide Walk, we gathered – to honour and give thanks for the lives of loved ones who spent their final days in the care of the Central Districts team. We had such a beautiful day. Thank you for making this event possible. You touched lives and melted hearts that day!

When a family chooses the time for a loved one to go into Mary Potter Palliative Care Services, they open the doors to a full circle of support that goes beyond nursing and medical care.

Not only do patients and their families gain the support of two professional and caring Social Workers, but they also have you as a supporter in their corner.

Our Social Workers, Sigourney and Isabelle assist patients and their loved ones to navigate the practical and emotional issues that arise during the end-of-life journey, but they couldn't do what they do, without you.

Sigourney and Isabelle are remarkably good at identifying what each person needs. But what makes the support they can offer extraordinary is the partnership they have with you. They know they can rely on you at any time in the patient's journey to help them provide the extra level of care required.

"I know within the shortest of timeframes, I can call on the Foundation to organise anything from a romantic dinner for two, to a birthday celebration for a family. The partnership is profoundly important to the way I can holistically support a patient and their loved ones in my role at Mary Potter Hospice," says Sigourney.

For Isabelle, who supports patients in the Palliative Home Care Service, it is about being able to call the Foundation at any time to arrange for a home cleaner or gardener or for the hire of a hospital bed in the patient's home.

"These 'extras' you help fund make such a difference to the clinical care I can provide. Because of your support, we can help make patients with mobility issues more comfortable and take away some of the stress that a loved one faces in a primary carer role," says Isabelle.

Thank you for being there to answer the call of our Social Workers. You make extraordinary care possible at Mary Potter Hospice and in the Palliative Home Care Service.



Imagine receiving a cancer diagnosis during a global pandemic? It would be a scary, stressful and a completely overwhelming time.

Because of your generosity we have been able to continue to make a positive difference through the RESTORE program. This program supports people receiving cancer treatment at Calvary North Adelaide Hospital and Calvary Central District Hospital.

We met with Shannon, our RESTORE Coordinator who spoke to us about what a difference the RESTORE cancer wellness program makes to patients as we navigate through the COVID-19 pandemic.

Many people living with cancer experience heightened feelings of concern about the risks associated with COVID-19 as people living with cancer may experience a weaker immune system. The RESTORE program offers so much more than the holistic benefits of a 15 minute massage. It allows

the time for a patient to have a chat and overcome feelings of isolation associated with COVID-19 social distancing.

"For a patient to be able to attend their weekly cancer treatment, that allows the gift of time for a patient to enjoy a 15 minute hand or foot massage and a chat with our friendly complementary therapist – it is truly something special. For many it is the only thing they have to look forward to each week...living with a cancer diagnosis can be a particularly isolating time during the COVID-19 pandemic," says Shannon.

This year we were fortunate to be able to add reflexology at Calvary Central District Hospital thanks to you.

Unfortunately three of the RESTORE workshops were cancelled but as restrictions eased, we were able to continue to offer the workshops once again. Workshops empower patients and their families with knowledge and understanding of what they can do to complement their treatment.

Thank you so much for making the RESTORE program available during a particularly overwhelming year for people living with cancer.

The kindness and generosity of the business community, trusts and foundations, schools, community groups and churches are vital to the funding of Mary Potter Palliative Care Services. Thank you for your generous support in 2020/2021.
