It was a joy to have their home filled with the smells of their favourite food and the giggling and laughter coming from their grandchildren as they played with their cousins. Capturing the richness of life: Patients tell their story in their own words, thanks to you

Did you know that your gifts to the Foundation provide palliative patients with the opportunity to record their life stories?

Capturing fond memories and the key moments of a person's life is not only a fulfilling process for a patient, but it can create a lasting legacy for family and friends to cherish.

Thanks to you this service is completely free. Life Stories Program Coordinator, Lian shares the importance of the program and thanks you for the gift you give to patients.

"Thank you for allowing me to remind a person of how wonderful their life has been," says Lian.

There are many reasons a patient will want to share their story. Sometimes it's to release the tension of a difficult life. Other times to express their love for their family and share snippets of wisdom.

Life stories provide a platform for people to share their life story in their own words.



Through the process of telling their story, they can celebrate their identity and detach from their condition or illness. It allows them to process their thoughts and reflect on their life to see how meaningful and rich it was. This can help them find more peace during the final stages of their life.

When we asked Lian why she wants to thank you, she says, "It's because of the big smiles and enjoyment I see on a patient's face when they read back their own life affirming story. This is when they realise how fulfilling their life has been".


